# INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

The paper size of the abstract should be one 21 x 29.7 cm (A4) page with a margin of 4.0 cm on the left and the right and 5.0 cm on the top and the bottom. The Abstract should be formatted using Calibri (Standard Windows font) throughout and single-spaced lines.

**File name:** Last name of the first author-two first words of the title  
(for example: **Hofmann-Asymmetric transfer.doc(x)** - download template)

Title: 11 pts, bold, centred, **not all caps** (for example, **Asymmetric transfer...**)

Empty space: 10 pts.

Author names: 10 pts, centred, not all caps; use first names, initials (optional) and last name;  
one author must be underlined as the author who will present the paper  
(for example: Bob. D. Hofmann, Peter. D. Smith\*, ...)

Empty space: 10 pts.

*Affiliation:* 10 pts, *italic*, centred; put all authors' addresses delineated by asterisk (\*) against each name,  
for example: *Institute of Pharamcy, Roma ,..... , \*University of Zagreb, Croatia,.....*

Empty space: 10 pts.

Abstract text: 10 pts, justified

Paragraphs should not be indented.

Empty space: 10 pts.

*Acknowledgement (optional): 10 pts, italic, justified*

Empty space: 10 pts.

Reference

10 pts, in accordance to Guide for Authors of **ADMET and DMPK** (Link is [HERE](#))

Text: Indicate references by number(s) in square brackets in line with the text. The actual authors can be referred to, but the reference number(s) must always be given.

**Example:** "..... as demonstrated [3,6]. Barnaby and Jones [8] obtained a different result ...."

List: Number the references (numbers in square brackets) in the list in the order in which they appear in the text.

Examples:

Reference to a journal publication:

[1] J. van der Geer, J.A.J. Hanraads, R.A. Lupton, The art of writing a scientific article, J. Sci. Commun. 163 (2000) 51-59.

Reference to a book:

[2] W. Strunk Jr., E.B. White, The Elements of Style, third ed., Macmillan, New York, 1979.

Reference to a chapter in an edited book:

[3] G.R. Mettam, L.B. Adams, How to prepare an electronic version of your article, in: B.S. Jones, R.Z. Smith (Eds.), Introduction to the Electronic Age, E-Publishing Inc., New York, 1999, pp. 281-304.
